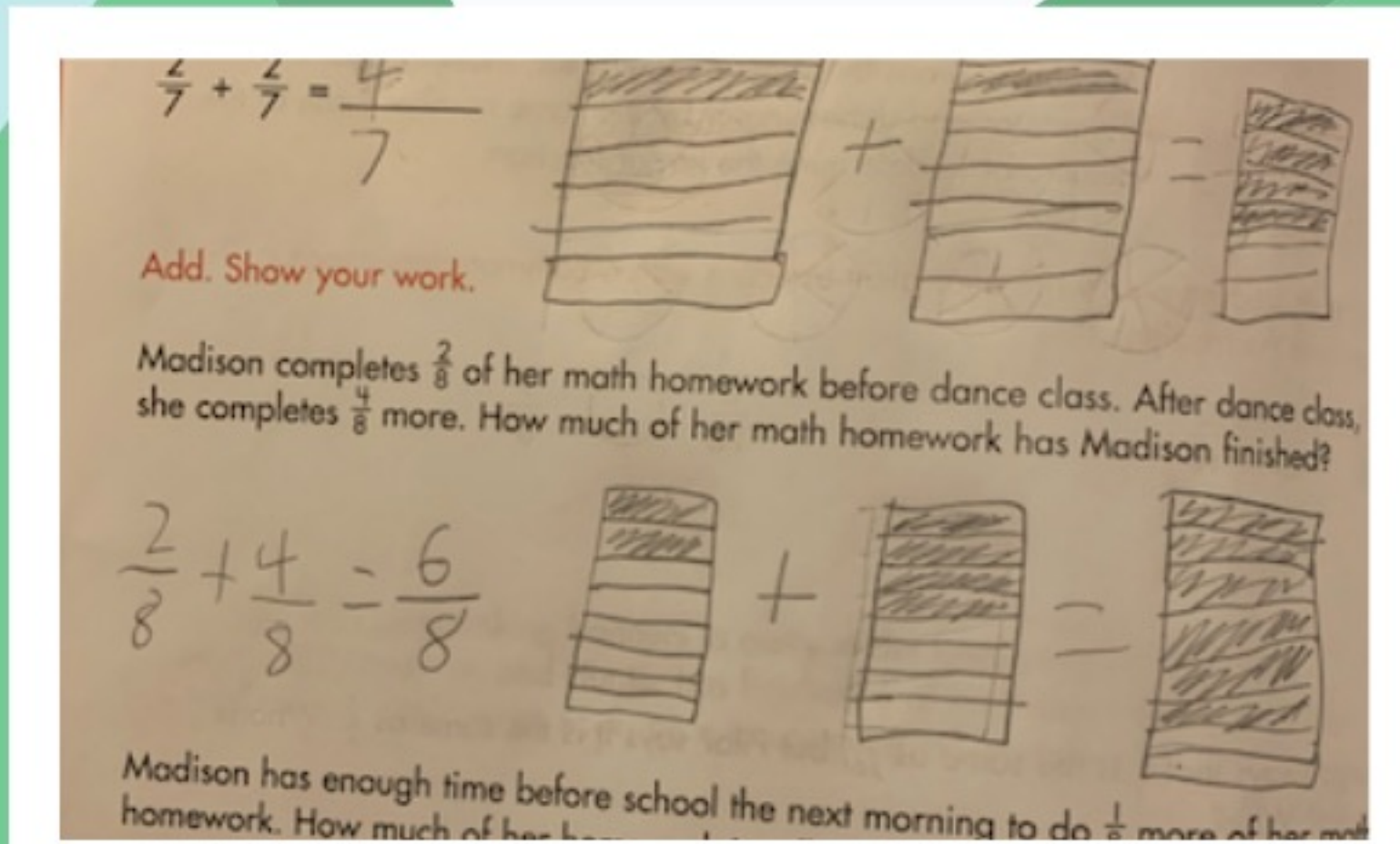

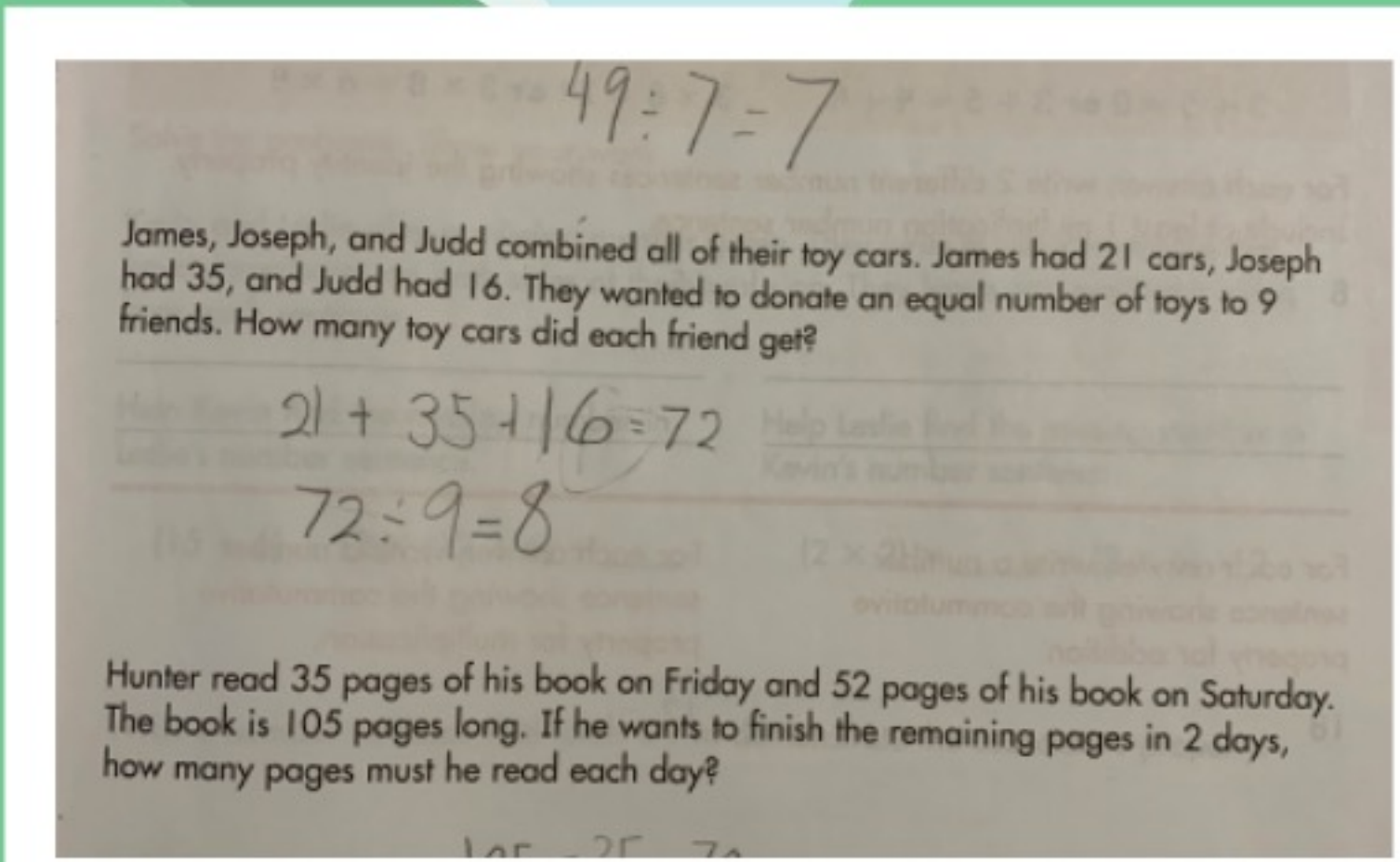

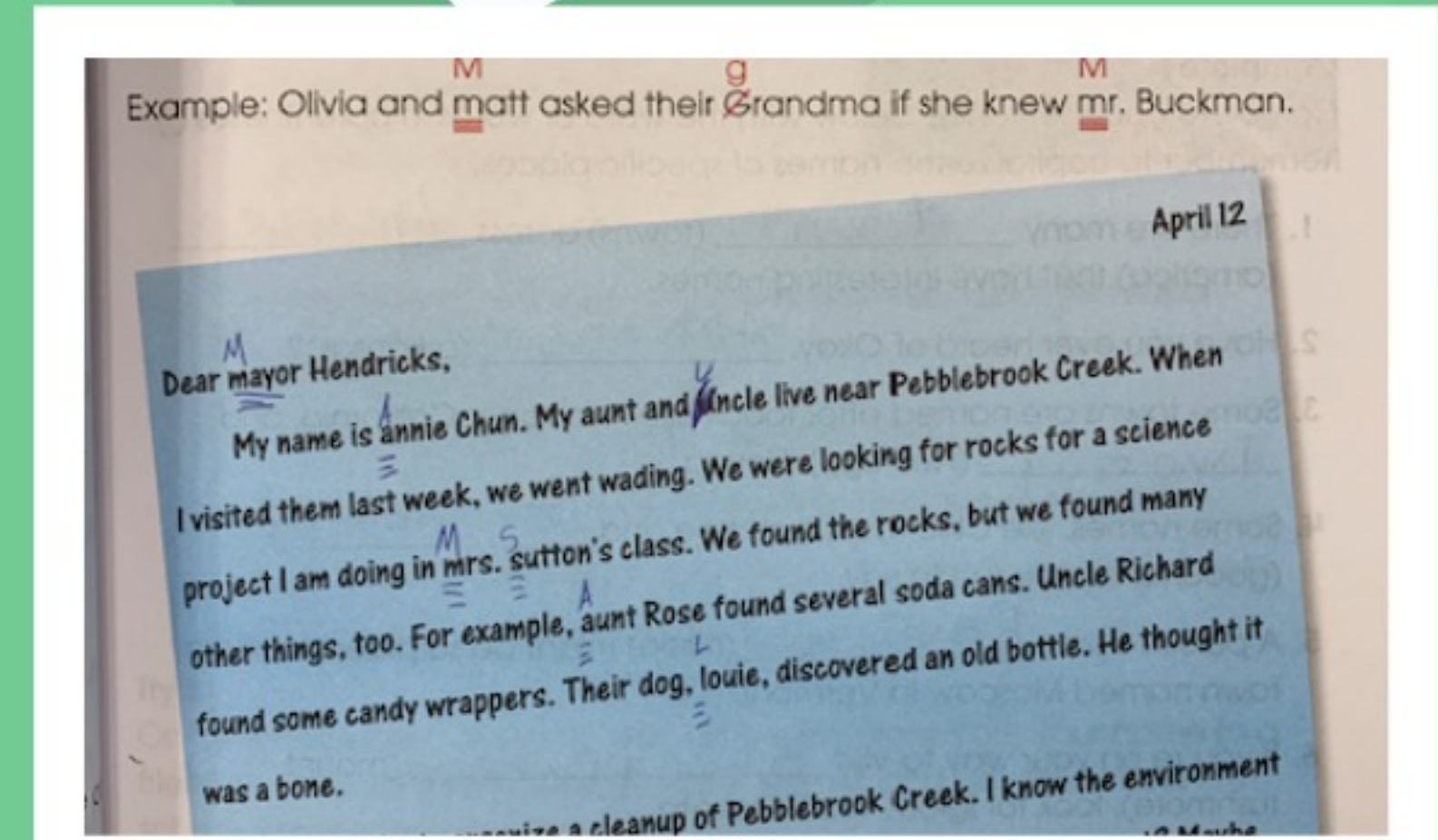
Young A+ students demonstrate their writing skills by submitting their homework (1/2)

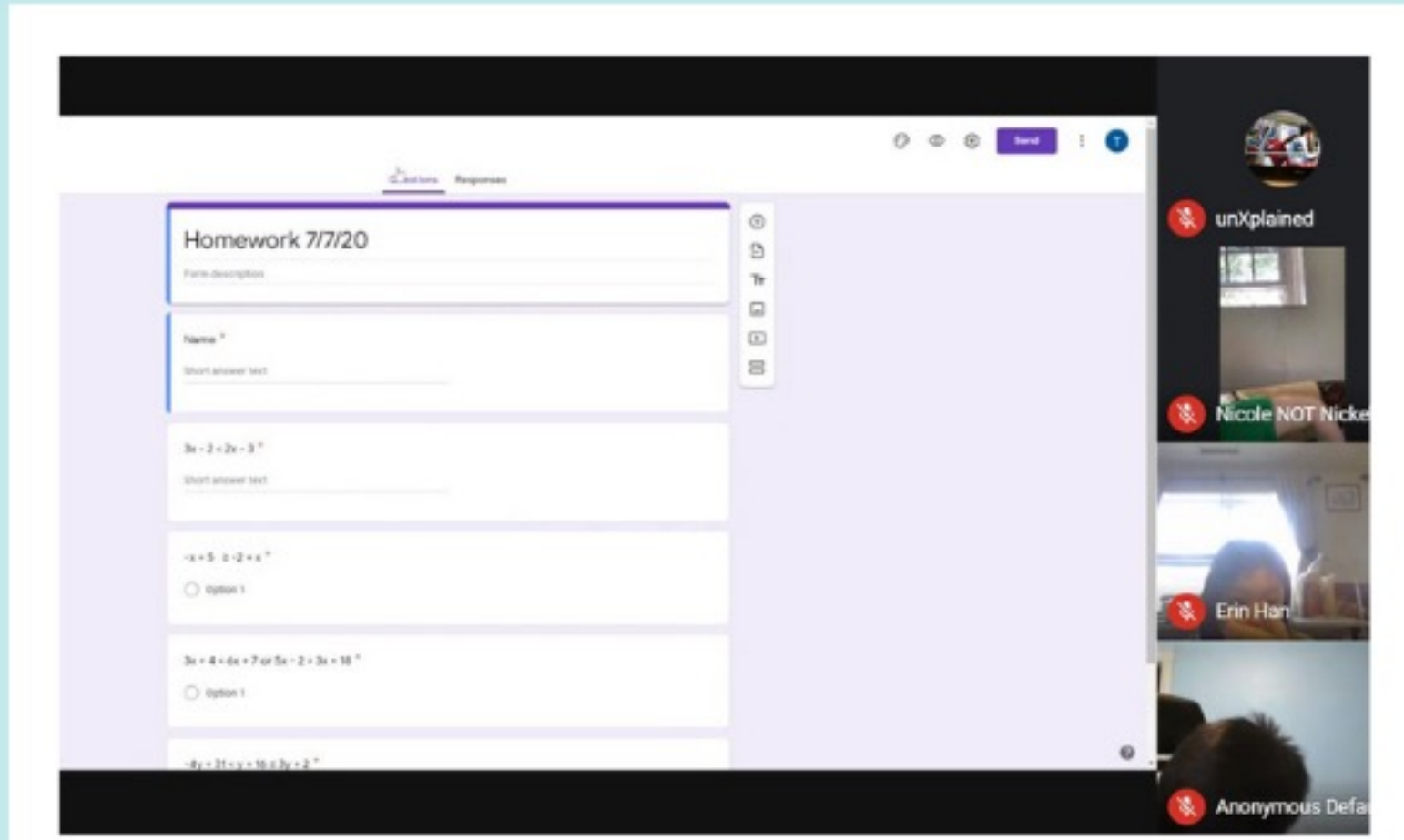

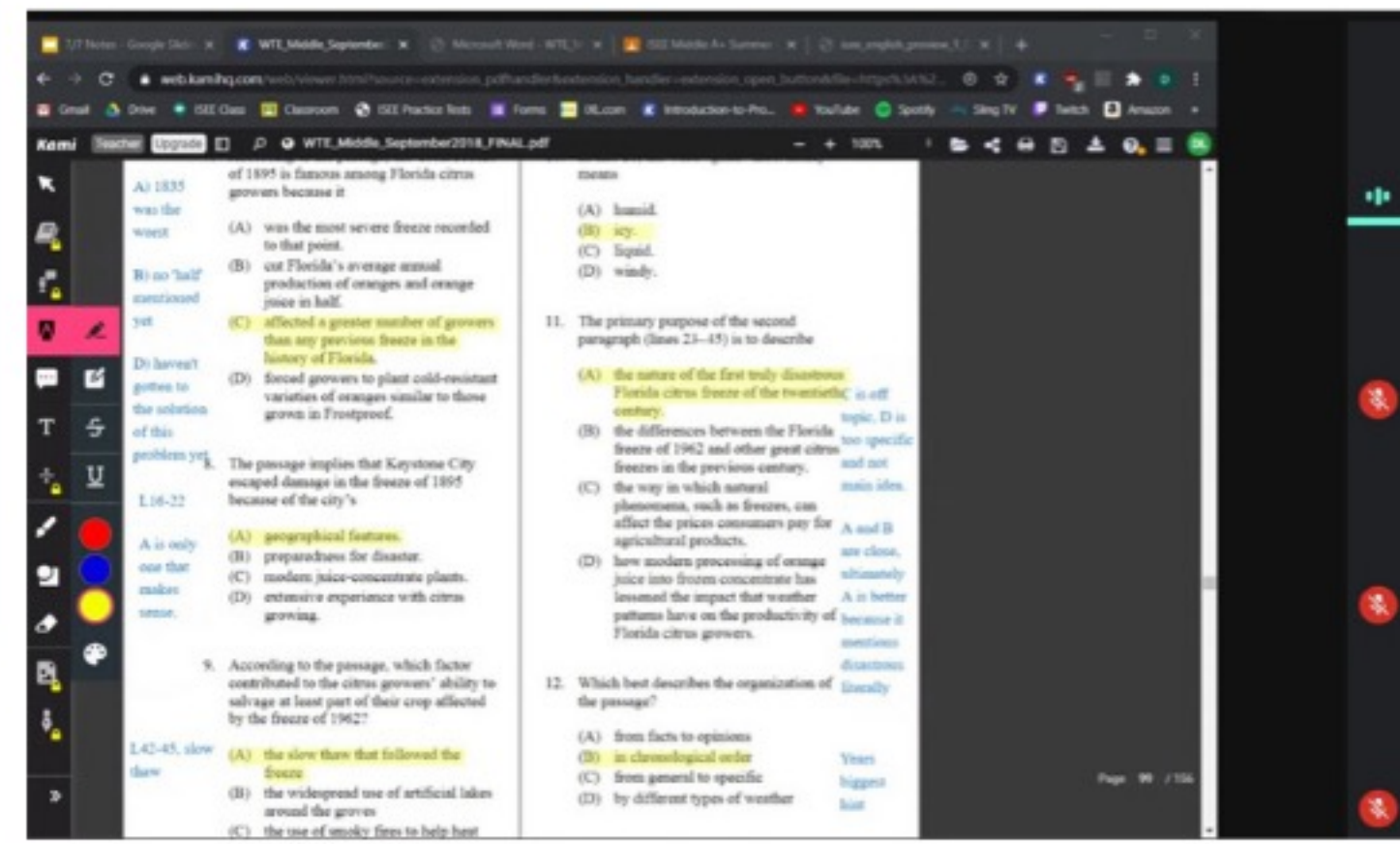

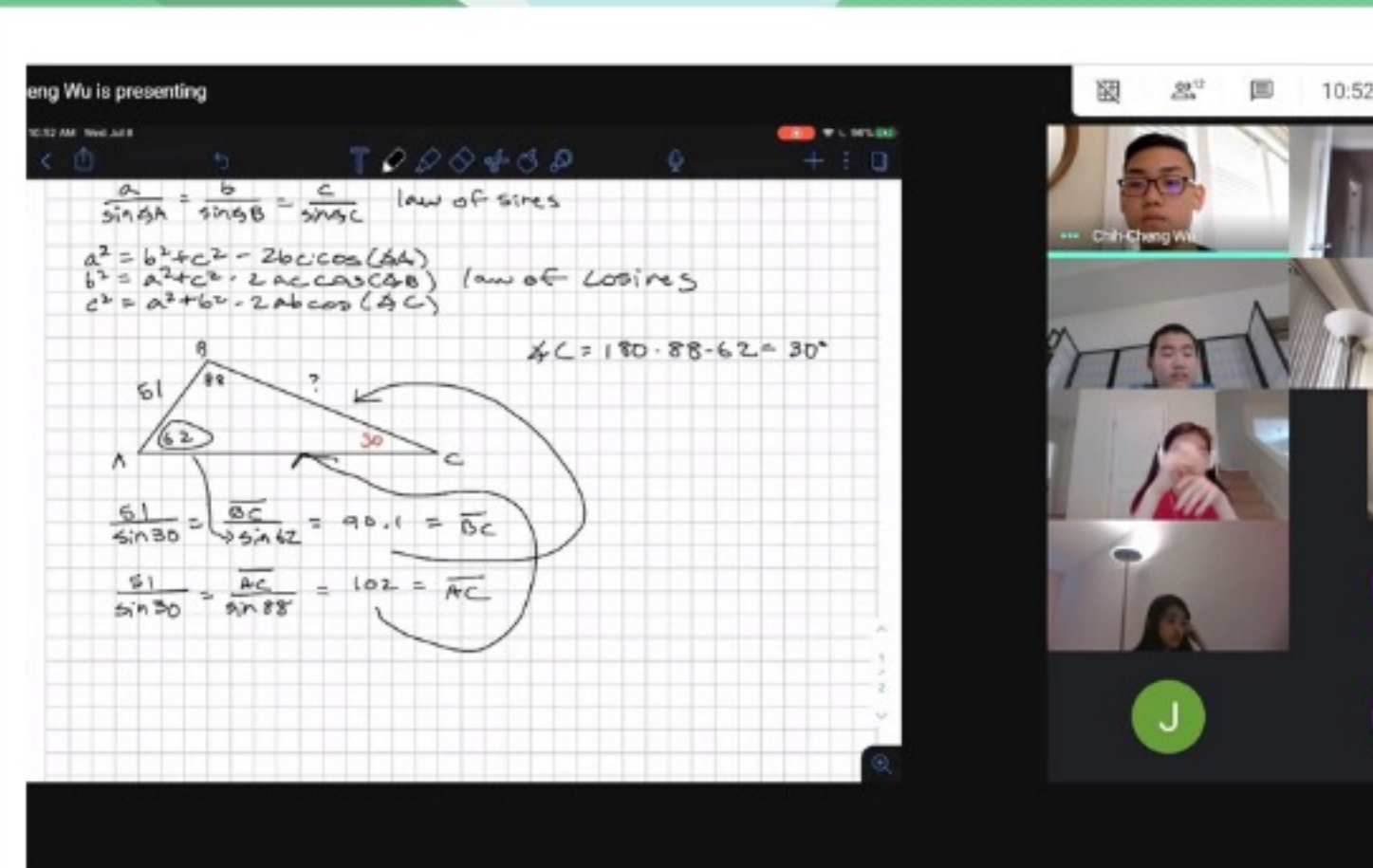

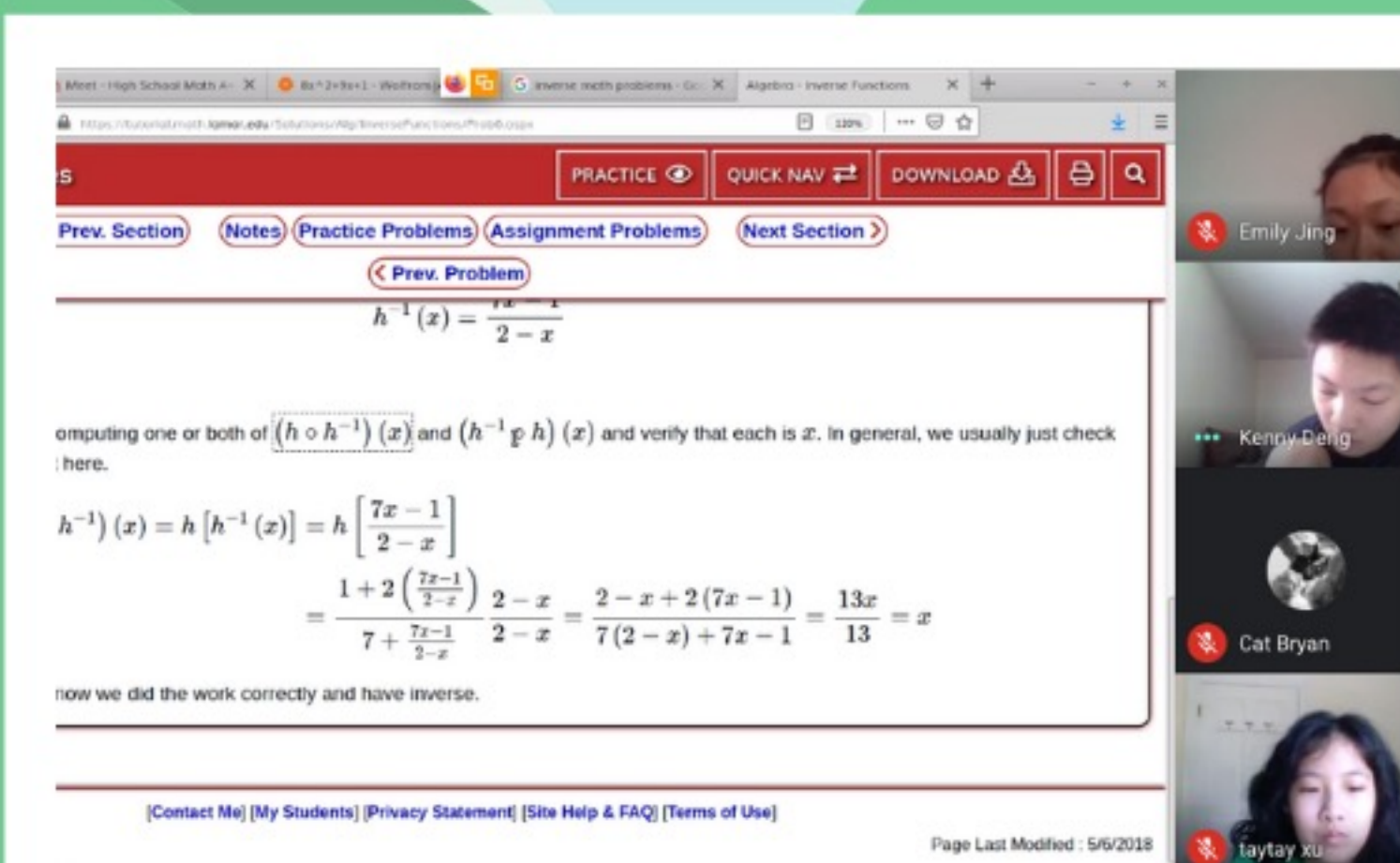

team. This way it can prevent the problem of having the president and vice president from different parties. Similarly, today, the Electoral College is proved ineffective. Therefore we should change the system and allow the candidate with the most popular vote to win.

First, the Electoral College is an anachronism. In the past, many people didn't receive enough education and had little knowledge about politics. They might not make the best decisions when electing the president, so having the Electoral College instead of a direct election would allow people that are more knowledgeable to choose the president. However, things are different now. People today are way more educated than the people back then, and students can learn about politics in school. Most people have some understanding of politics. More than that, with the development of technology, people can get information easily using the internet. They can search up the stance of the candidates and the issues of the country to make the best choice. Therefore the Electoral College is no longer needed.

Second, the Electoral College gives swing states more power. Many states usually lean to a single party, for example, Massachusetts leans to Democrat and Kansas leans to Republican. In these states, it is almost certain which candidate will win, the candidates won't spend too much effort on canvassing. What the candidates need to pay more attention to are the swing states because both candidates have a chance to win, and winning in the swing states will give a big advantage. That is to say, swing states are the most important factors that determine a candidate wins or loses. They have more influence on the outcome of the election, this makes the swing states to be more powerful than the other states.

Lastly, the Electoral College sometimes ignores the will of the people. For instance, in
